From the Director...

Some scripts just grab you from the beginning with a sense of familiarity and real wonder about where they're going, such is "Good People" by David Lindsey-Abaire. It's funny, to be simple about it, but that's not all. So many scripts follow characters we have seen before, Margaret is not that at all. She's a 50 plus woman working (for the moment) at a Dollar Store as a cashier. We see a flawed protagonist dealing with basic survival and just looking for a job as a one of the most common forgotten members of our society; a lower class, over 50 women. She's raw, sort of decent and probably a little racist but worth following because there are so many of us that share her troubles. And there are a lot of us that fall on our own sword for pride. There's a lot of funny here but her story reminds me of times when the money was short, and a real desperation and pain permeated every second of my life. I've never heard a better description than Margie's in act 2 of exactly that feeling. A feeling we should be reminded of if only not to feel so alone when and if it unfortunately happens again. Which, to me, is the point of good stories, to feel less alone in the world because someone described a feeling in a way that lets us know that someone out there understands. But it's not all doom and gloom and sad in the "Good People" world. The humor is fantastic, it's witty without winking at us and the settings are wonderful. It'll truly be a great time for an audience while sharing things that are worth sharing. And we've got pottery bunnies.

What's made this come to life is a great cast, great support team of designers and good friends. And a special thanks to Deborah Bromley for being a fantastic Assistant Director and dealing with my nonsense. And, of course, to Lori Nalangan for taking on this marathon of a show and doing so with a grin.

GEORGEANN WALLACE (DOTTIE)




